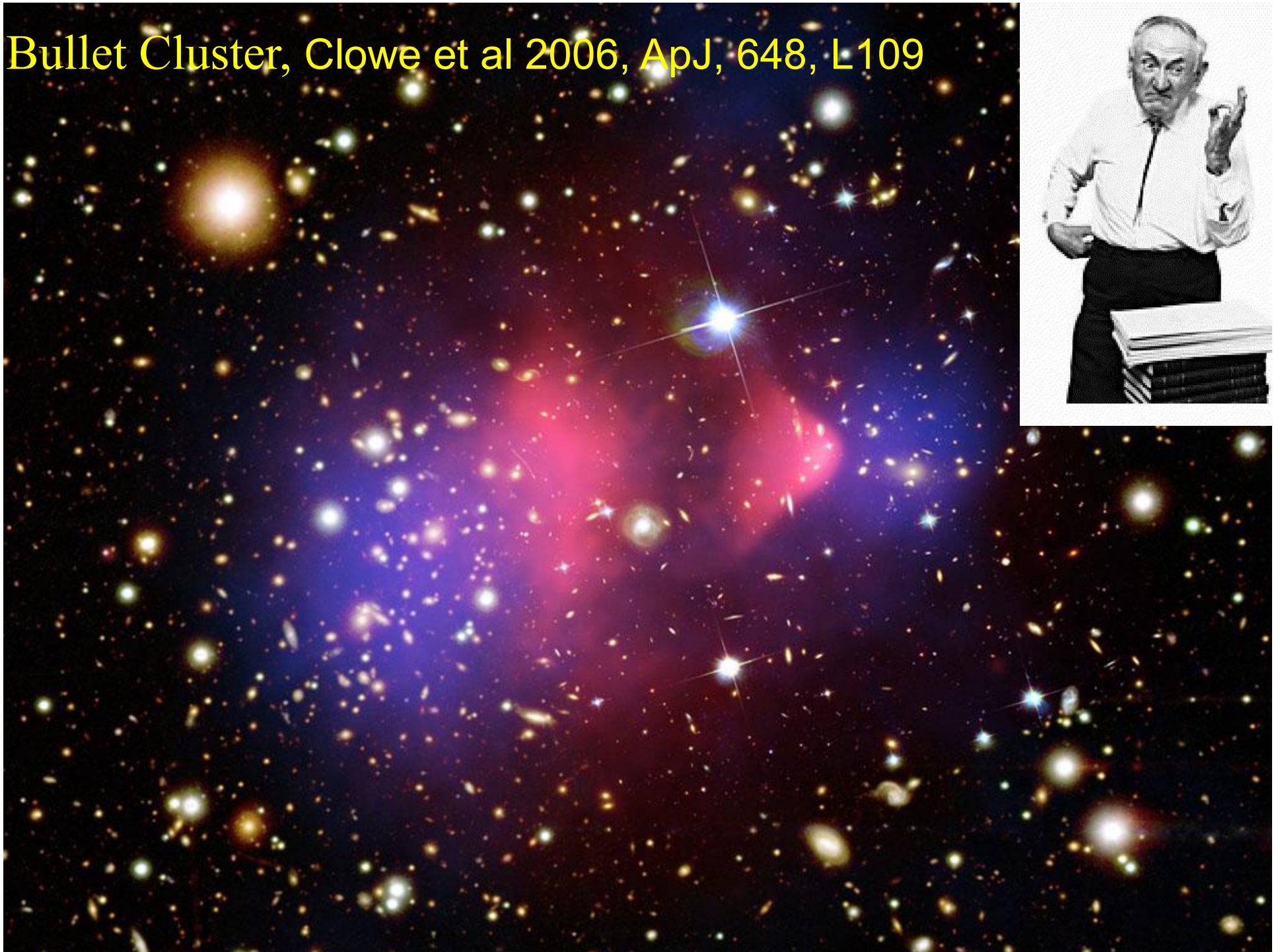




M33 rotation curve

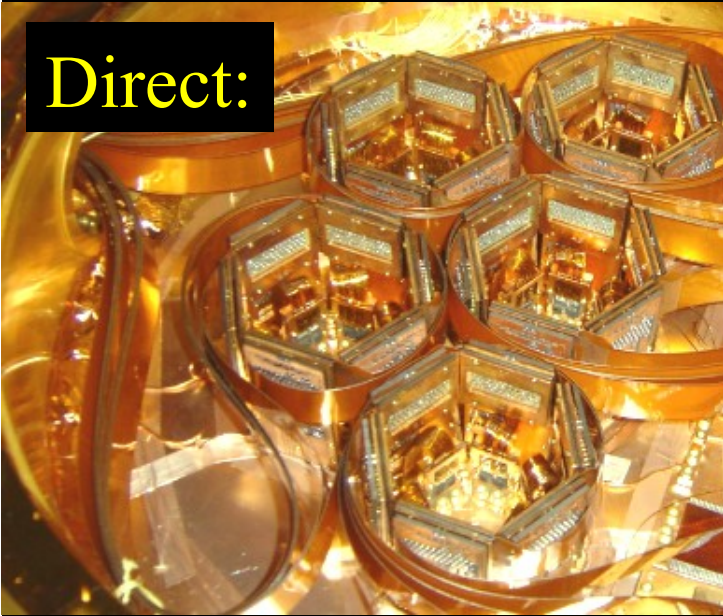
